

Replacing a failed power supply unit in an H600S series chassis

Each H600S series chassis includes two power supply units for power redundancy. If a power supply unit fails, you must replace it as soon as possible to ensure that the chassis has a redundant power source.


Before you begin

- You have determined that the power supply unit has failed.
- You have a replacement power supply unit.
- You have verified that the redundant power source is operating.
- You have an electrostatic discharge (ESD) wristband, or you have taken other antistatic precautions.

About this task

The instructions apply if you have a one-rack unit (1U) chassis with H600S series storage nodes.

The following illustration shows the back of a chassis with the two power supply units:




•	Power supply units
	PSU0 is on the right and PSU1 is on the left.

Steps

- 1. Locate the failed power supply unit.
 - The LED on the failed unit displays amber.
- 2. Unplug the power cord from the power supply unit that you are replacing.

3. Remove the power supply unit as shown in the following illustrations:




Attention: Ensure that you use both hands to support the weight of the power supply unit.

4. Install the replacement as shown in the following illustrations:

Slide the power supply unit into the chassis.

Ensure that the blue latch is on the right side when you slide the unit in.



Attention: Do not use excessive force when sliding the power supply unit into the chassis to prevent damage to the hardware.

- 5. Plug in the power cord.
- **6.** Return the failed unit to NetApp by following the instructions in the box that was shipped to you.
